## **Concept Note**

Development is a multifaceted and plural concept. It combines holistic perspectives and efforts for economic growth, human well-being, equity, inclusiveness, freedom and justice. Development processes operate through dynamic interfaces via economy, society, and environmental interactions. The larger aim of development is to achieve societal-economic progress while maintaining harmonious relationships with nature. Today, the world is witnessing unprecedented and new development challenges of different types and magnitudes. Billions of people have faced the vagaries of global climate change, widespread ecological disasters, economic hardship, rural development challenges, urban crises, dwindling agricultural growth, universal health, education, and diverse socio-economic and regional disparities. In addition, in any society or nation-state, contestations prevail over development issues like economic growth versus inequality and redistribution, rising affluence alongside prevailing poverty and deprivation, individual well-being side by side with marginalization of certain communities, and the progress of society at the cost of nature. There is thus an urgent need to reorient geographical research to comprehend the diverse nature of such contemporary development issues and redefine the future roadmap.

Geographical research analyses and contributes to a wide range of issues, encompassing various environmental interfaces of economic and social development challenges. It critically evaluates public policies that aim to initiate development processes which operate on different geographical and 5 sectoral scales. It engages with critical questions, diverse theoretical perspectives, and intellectual positions to comprehend the ongoing processes and their outcomes.

Geographers are uniquely equipped with a balanced understanding of socio-economic-cultural aspects and their relation to natural entities. They can provide alternative development possibilities, policy interventions, and formulate sustainable practices for overcoming shortfalls in achieving equitable development. They have an essential edge in investigating the most pressing global and local development issues. The forthcoming International Seminar on "Geography for Development: Economy, Society and Environmental Interactions" invites academics and practitioners from different geographies to critically engage and contribute towards a better understanding of our current development issues and suggest probable best practices for their solutions.

In accordance with the concept note, the following are the main subthemes of the seminar:

- i. Economic Development: Economic Growth; Employment-Formal and Informal Sectors and Emerging Labour.
- ii. Rural Development: Role of Banking and Micro-Credit in Rural Transformation.
- iii. Agriculture and Development: Spatiality of Cropping Patterns; Technological Innovations; Land, Labour and Capital in Agriculture.
- iv. Tourism and Development, Transport Linkages and Trade.
- v. Development and Social Wellbeing: Quality of Life, Social Deprivation, Inequality and Social Justice.
- vi. Urbanisation, Planning and Regional Development: Sustainable Urbanism; Amenities and Accessibility; Right to the City; Emerging Theories.
- vii. Population and Development: Population Growth, Migration, Nutrition, Food Security and Public Health; Human Development.
- viii. Gender, Culture, Space and Development.
- ix. Politics of Development: Geopolitics; Development and Dispossession; Elections and Governance.
- x. Physical Geography for Development: Managing Anthropogenic Landscapes; Natural Hazard Susceptibility and Vulnerability; Applied Geomorphology for Regional Development.
- xi. Environment and Natural Resources: Managing Soils, Forests and Waterscapes.
- xii. Climate Change and Development Challenges.
- xiii. Contemporary Development and Governance in West Bengal.
- xiv. Recent Flagship Development Policies in India.

# Proposal for Organising Special Technical Sessions

## Young Geographers' Award

A competition will be organised to select one young geographer. The criteria for participation in the competition are as follows:

- The participant should be below 30 years of age. The participant should be an Indian National.
- A single-authored abstract should be submitted within the deadline mentioned in the abstract submission section.
- The last date for submitting the full paper via email to the convenor (email id: <a href="mailto:iigpresidency@gmail.com">iigpresidency@gmail.com</a>) is 15th December 2024.
- A bonafide certificate from the Head of the Department or Supervisor(s) should be submitted along with the abstract.
- Copy of the institutional identity card.

## **Presidency University**

Presidency University occupies a unique place in the history of education in India. It was one of the first institutes of Western-type higher education in Asia. In 1817, a group of enlightened Indians and Englishmen set up the Hindoo College. This was taken over by the British Government in 1855 as the College of the Bengal Presidency and placed in 1857 under the newly founded Calcutta University.

Over the next hundred years and more, Presidency College was Bengal's preeminent centre of higher learning. Although a Constituent College of Calcutta University, it preserved a tradition of research matched by few universities in India. This gave a unique dimension to its undergraduate teaching. The formal establishment of Presidency University in July 2010 allows it to refashion its venerable traditions and continuing strengths into a leading institution of the future.

## **Department of Geography**

Department of Geography started functioning in 1949 –1950 in the erstwhile Presidency College with Prof. N. R. Kar (Head), Dr A. B. Chatterjee and Dr S. P. Dasgupta, R. K. Basu (Demonstrator), G. C. Roy (Draftsman) and Md. Ramzan Ali (Bearer). Thus, it is one of the oldest geography departments in the country. Department is on the verge of completing 75 years of its academic journey in the present year, 2024-25. The department has a brilliant galaxy of alumni comprising eminent geographers working in India and abroad.

The present department includes 14 faculty members with diverse expertise across human and physical geography. It offers specialisation in various fields and sub-fields. The department is well-equipped with multiple learning resources and dedicated laboratories for advanced research in physical and human geography. The department has completed the DST-FIST (Phase 1) programme, Government of India.

The Organising Committee seeks submissions of abstracts of original contributions on any topic related to the scientific programme sessions. If you wish to submit an abstract for consideration, kindly follow the instructions outlined below.


#### **Guidelines for Preparing Abstracts:**

- 1. Title: A brief title within 20 words is suggested. It should be in bold type, capitalising the 1st letter of all words of four letters or more.
- 2. Author(s): The family name(s) should be typed in CAPITAL letters and the first and middle name(s) with first letter capital.
- 3. Affiliation of the author(s) should be listed by number, and add the number in superscript form after the name(s). Put a '\*' mark on the corresponding author.
- 4. Text: The abstract must clearly indicate the problem, methodology and result of the work **within 300 words/2000 characters** (Abstracts above this limit will not be accepted).

## **Necessary Information:**

- Abstracts and registration fees should be submitted through the mentioned links by 30th October 2024.
- Hard copy/Email submission of abstracts will not be accepted.
- All author (s) will be required to register for the Conference to ensure their abstract(s) is/are included in the technical sessions(s) and abstract volume.
- Acceptance of selected abstracts will be notified to the corresponding author on or before 30<sup>th</sup> November 2024 by email only.
- Full papers for the Young Geographers' competition should be submitted by **15**<sup>th</sup> **December 2024**.



- Sessions may not be held if there are insufficient abstracts submitted; abstracts submitted in any session that is not held will be re-allocated to a different session by the Programme Committee.
- After receiving full-length papers, we plan to publish an edited book/ volume/
  conference proceedings from any reputed national or international publisher.
  The last date for submitting full-length papers is 30th December 2024. Submit
