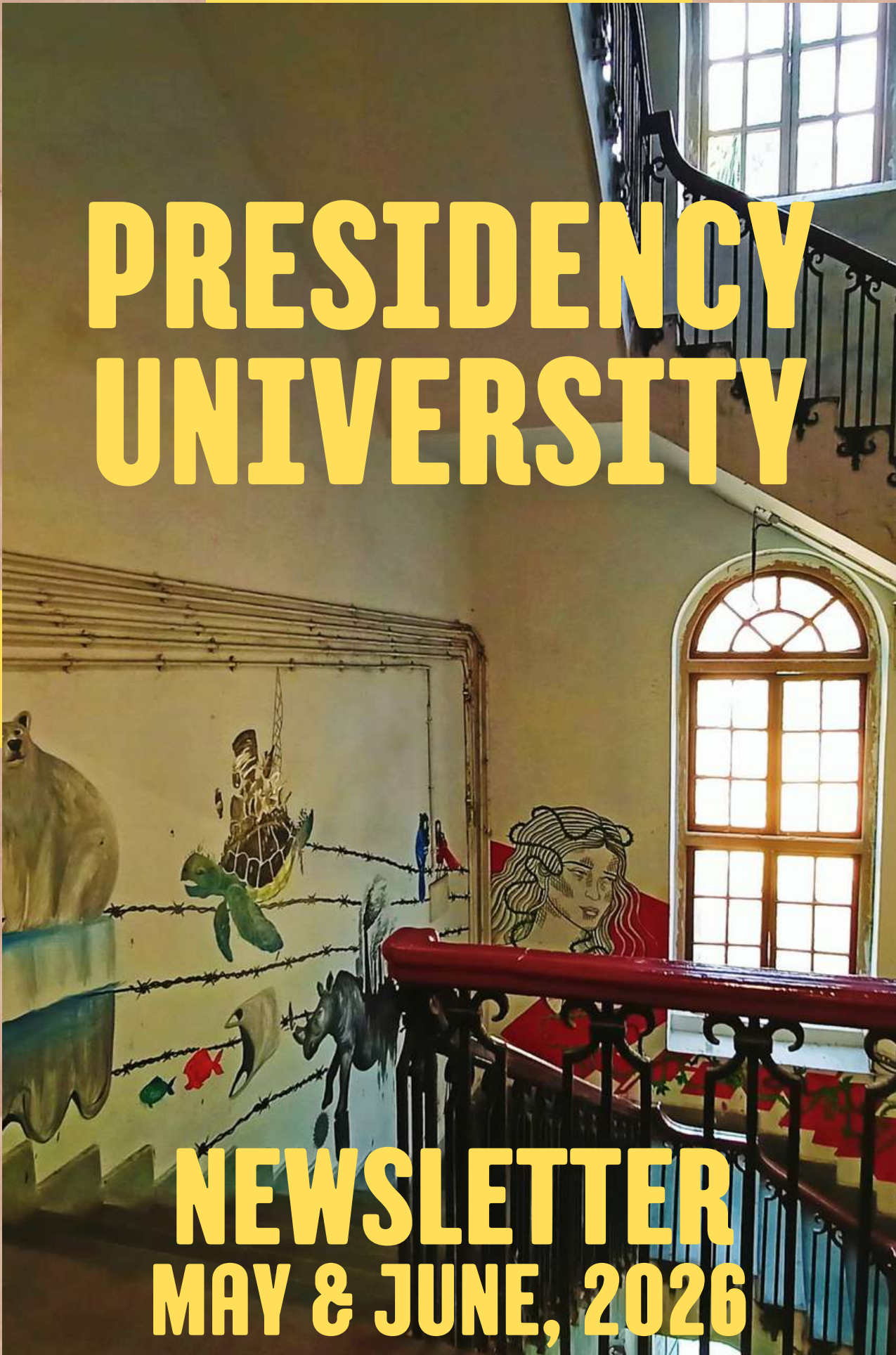

DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICS

PRESISION 2026: A TWO-DAY SCIENCE OUTREACH PROGRAM

PRESISION 2026, a two-day National Science Outreach Program organized by the Presidency University Physics Society, was held on 18-19 April 2026 at Presidency University, Kolkata. The event brought together students and young researchers from across the country for scientific exchange and learning. Highlights included plenary lectures by Dr. Samridhhi Sankar Ray, ICTS-TIFR, Bengaluru, on fluid dynamics and Dr. Sudip Jana, HRI, Allahabad, on neutrinos, a panel discussion on careers in physics, and a student public talk on high-energy astrophysics. Panelists include Prof. Debasish Majumdar, RKMVERI, Belur Prof. Archan S Majumdar, SNBNCBS, Kolkata Dr. Aritra Banerjee, Calcutta University Prof. Satyaban Bhunia, SINP, Kolkata With 175 participants, oral and poster presentations, science exhibitions, and a physics quiz, the program successfully fostered scientific curiosity, collaboration, and outreach.



SCHOOL OF ASTROPHYSICS

COLLOQUIUMS

On 6 May 2026, the School of Astrophysics hosted a colloquium by Prof. Chayan Mondal of SNBNCBS, Kolkata, titled "AstroSat UV Deep Field: From Interstellar Dust to Lyman Continuum Leaking Galaxies at Redshift $\sim 0.5-3.0$." The talk highlighted how the AstroSat AUDF survey, combined with UVIT and JWST MIRI observations, is advancing our understanding of galaxy evolution between cosmic noon and the present universe. Prof. Mondal discussed breakthroughs in studying dust attenuation, PAH emissions, and the identification of Lyman Continuum-leaking galaxies. He also presented the discovery of GNHell J1236+6215 ($z = 2.98$), a candidate hosting Population III-like star formation, with important implications for understanding cosmic reionization and the early universe.



On May 13, Prof. Manoneeta Chakraborty, IIT Indore presented "Neutron Stars: A Journey into Ultra-Dense Matter," where she used uGMRT data to decode pulsar subpulse drifting and magnetar emission mechanisms. She also highlighted the search for nano-Hertz gravitational waves and the role of X-ray binaries in probing the physics of extreme gravity and magnetic fields. We thank our speakers for making this landmark semester an academic triumph. Under the coordination of Dr. Ritaban Chatterjee, the department made a special effort to feature distinguished women scientists, bookending the term with Dr. Paramita Dasgupta (OSU) and Prof. Manoneeta Chakraborty (IIT Indore).



A SPECIAL SEMINAR

On 20 May 2026, the School of Astrophysics hosted a special seminar by Dr. Abhijit Anand from IUCAA, Pune, titled "Tracing the Cosmic Metal Cycle: Observational Probes of the CGM and IGM from $z \sim 0.5$ to 3." Dr. Anand discussed the role of the circumgalactic and intergalactic media in galaxy evolution, highlighting how galaxies exchange gas and metals through the cosmic baryon cycle. Drawing on data from major surveys such as SDSS and DESI, he demonstrated how quasar absorption lines, particularly MgII and CIV absorbers, can trace diffuse gas flows across cosmic time. The talk also explored efforts to combine observations, emission-line mapping, and simulations to better understand galaxy halos.



DEPARTMENT OF SOCIOLOGY

A BOOK DISCUSSION ON "FOR A JUST REPUBLIC: THE PEOPLE OF INDIA AND THE STATE (COLUMBIA UNIVERSITY PRESS, 2026)"

On 11 May 2026, a book discussion was held on For a Just Republic: The People of India and the State (Columbia University Press, 2026) by Prof. Partha Chatterjee. The panel featured Dr. Garima Dhabai, Dr. Kalyan Das, and Dr. Md. Inamur Rahman of Presidency University, along with Dr. Himadri Chatterjee of the University of Calcutta. Describing the book as a major contribution to understanding post-independence India, the speakers engaged with its arguments on justice, Ambedkar and the Constitution, regional political economy, and questions of language, ethnicity, and nationalism. The discussion concluded with Prof. Chatterjee's responses and an interactive session with students and faculty.

THE DIALEGO DEBATE

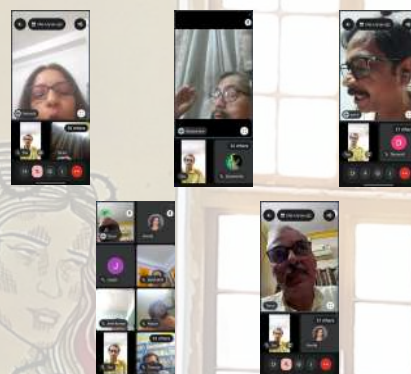

A floor debate segment encouraged active audience participation, fostering lively discussion and critical engagement. The competition was judged by Dr. Tanwir Arshed, Dr. Garima Dhabhai, and Dr. Nabamita Das, while Prof. Sumit Chakrabarti, Dean of Humanities and Social Sciences, attended as the Guest of Honour. The event provided a stimulating platform for debate, critical thinking, and intellectual exchange.

INSIDE REAL-WORLD AI SYSTEMS: A PRACTICAL VIEW OF DATA AND DECISIONS

On 8 May 2026, the Department of Mathematics at Presidency University, in collaboration with the Computational Research and Operations Wing (CROW), virtually hosted the second session of the six-part cohort series, Inside Real-World AI Systems: A Practical View of Data and Decisions. Led by technology expert Mr. Sanjoy Chatterjee, the session engaged 16 students at the P.C. Mahalanobis Auditorium. Focusing on practical, data-driven decision-making, participants presented progress on interdisciplinary AI projects, discussed technical challenges, and explored collaborative problem-solving approaches. The programme continues to bridge theoretical mathematics with real-world AI applications, preparing students for advanced research and potential industry opportunities.



INSTITUTE OF PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION AND PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

TALK DELIVERED BY PROF. PARAMITA CHAKRABORTY

On 15 May 2026, the Institute of Public Administration and Professional Development (IPAPD) organised a lecture by Prof. Paramita Chakraborty, Assistant Professor of Painting at the Government College of Art and Craft, Calcutta, at the S.N. Bose Sabhagriha. Titled "Art as Dialogue: Between the Individual Voice and Collective Imagination," the talk explored the influences shaping her artistic journey across Kolkata, Santiniketan, and Pennsylvania. Prof. Chakraborty examined the relationship between realism, surrealism, truth, and creativity, while emphasizing the artist's role as both a creative and political agent in shaping collective imagination and social consciousness.

TALK ON "RETHINKING 'SCEPTICISM' WITH VASUBANDHU AND RATNAKĪRTI"

On 29 May 2026, the Department of Philosophy, Presidency University, hosted a lecture by Ethan Mills on "Rethinking 'Scepticism' with Vasubandhu and Ratnakīrti." The talk explored the challenges of applying philosophical categories across cultures and examined Buddhist perspectives on knowledge and experience. Drawing on the ideas of Vasubandhu and Ratnakīrti, Dr. Mills proposed an alternative framework of "epistemology of nondualism." The lecture concluded with an engaging discussion and question-answer session involving faculty members, researchers, and students.



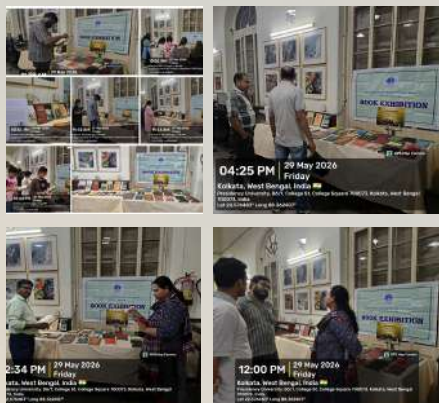
EVENTS OF LIBRARY

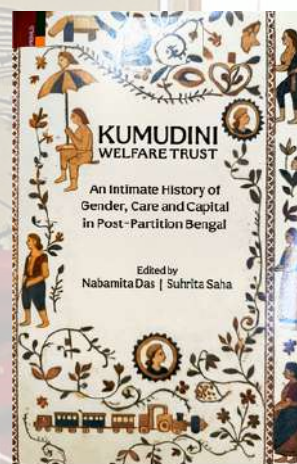
NASHA MUKT BHARAT ABHIYAN AWARENESS CAMPAIGN

DEPARTMENT OF MATHEMATICS

LECTURE SERIES ON, "UNDERSTANDING THE ARCHITECTURE"

On 24 June 2026, the Department of Mathematics hosted the third lecture of the Inside Real-World AI Systems series at MLT-1. Titled Understanding the Architecture, the session examined the structural framework of the EVIN project, covering data acquisition, preprocessing, knowledge extraction, and graph construction. Participants explored how these components convert raw data into structured insights for scalable event analysis, with emphasis on modular design, extensibility, and the integration of AI with knowledge-driven methodologies. Building on earlier sessions led by Mr. Sanjoy Chatterjee and the organizing team, the lecture strengthened participants' practical understanding of developing robust real-world AI pipelines.

BOOK EXHIBITION ON OLD AND RARE ARCHIVES OF PRESIDENCY UNIVERSITY LIBRARY

On 9 June 2026, the Presidency University Library organized an exhibition showcasing its invaluable collection of rare books, manuscripts, archival records, and historic journals from the seventeenth to the twentieth century. 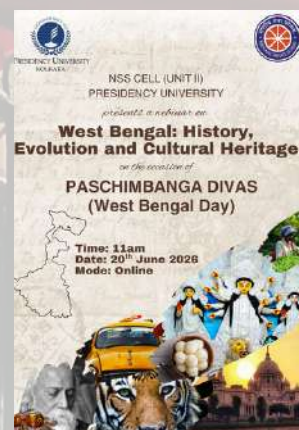


PASCHIM BANGA DIVAS CELEBRATION

At Presidency University, the significance of 20 June 1947—the day on which the Provincial Legislative Assembly voted in favour of West Bengal remaining a part of India—was highlighted through discussions on Bengal's social and historical journey on 20th June, 2026. Amit Dey, Ashutosh Professor of Medieval and Modern History at University of Calcutta, delivered a lecture on the intellectual history of Bengal in the context of nationalism. In the presence of Vice-Chancellor Prof. Nirmalya Narayan Chakraborty, Registrar Dr. Debajyoti Konar, along with teachers, students, and researchers, he traced various phases of Bengal's history.



The students of Presidency University observed Paschimbanga Divas on 20 June 2026 through an online programme. Students delivered speeches celebrating West Bengal's rich history, cultural heritage, and intellectual legacy, tracing its journey from the Pala-Sena era to the Bengal Renaissance and statehood. The programme highlighted the state's resilience, inclusivity, and creative excellence while inspiring participants to uphold its values and contribute to a progressive future.
