Measures taken to complete the syllabus of courses and programs.	<p>Planning and Scheduling Classes - One of the important parts of completing the syllabi is scheduling and meticulously planning the topics. Our departments set their individual routines to maximize the time allotted in imparting the classes. Once the individual scheduling is done the HoDs review with one another so that the students don't face any problem attending the intradepartmental classes.</p> <p>Teacher-Student Ratio - We try our best to maintain a balance so that none of the students are deprived of knowledge or information relevant to their courses along with special attention to the not so academically strong students.</p> <p>Tutorial Classes - Specially modified tutorial classes are arranged for the students or if they ask for one on one classes for further in-depth understanding of certain topics. We understand that everyone does not have the same level of learning capacity, hence these classes are very important not only to complete the syllabi but also for securing better grades by students. We try to make the teaching-learning process as fruitful as possible.</p> <p>Course Material - We encourage our students to write their own notes. The more they write and rewrite their understanding of the subject gets clearer and also helps the respective faculties to note how much the students are prepared after the syllabi is completed. We provide a list of suggestive books, journal articles or links which will help them in their endeavour.</p> <p>Regular Assignments and Practical Classes - During the run of the syllabi different departments give different assignments to respective batches. These include PPT presentations, discussions, debates and also field works. These help measures their preparedness as well as the successful completion of each structured syllabus.</p> <p>Surprised Tests - A very effectively tested and tried method is the surprise tests which easily gauge the effective rate of completion of the syllabi. This is religiously practised by our faculties of concerned departments and often these become a part of continuous assessment.</p> <p>Trans disciplinary Skills - Completing the syllabi not only mean that the students or research scholars are examination prepared but have the in depth knowledge, thus we set multiple check points as measures for successful completion by giving different tasks which will also check their trans disciplinary skills like, critical thinking skills, research skills, crisis management skills, communication skills, social responsibility and so on.</p> <p>Attendance - Above all our goal will not be complete if the students do not attend the classes, hence attendance percentage is very strictly adhered to. This is another important measure for completing the syllabi.</p> <p>Extra Classes and Extension - In case of dire necessities we also give extra classes to meet the requirement of students and extension for PhD scholars.</p>
