

The past and future of microcredit

Date of Event: 8th January, 2021


On the 8th of April, 2021, the department of Economics of Presidency College had conducted a digital seminar titled 'The past and future of microcredit'. The event was supervised and coordinated by Professor Zakir Hussain of Department of Economics, Presidency University. Professor Jonathan Murdoch graced the event with his deep and insightful presentation on microfinance, its history and how it should be perceived. Prof. Jonathan Morduch is currently Professor of Public Policy and Economics at the Robert F. Wagner Graduate School of Public Service, University of New York. He is a development economist most well-known for his significant academic contributions to assessing the impact of microfinance since the early years of the movement. What started in Dhaka has grown into a revolutionary movement around the world especially in a booming economies like India and Bangladesh. Microfinance refers to the financial services provided to low-income individuals or groups who are typically excluded from traditional banking. Through simple anecdotes and factual and graphical evidences Prof. Murdoch illustrated selective takes on the past and future of microfinance all the addressing rural poverty with focus on homogeneous participation irrespective of gender, or economic class, participation of NGOs, along with talks of nutrition, health and education. Challenges of development policies like market failure, unreliable services, social business, harnessing the market to reach mass scale and deprivation of the poor communities due to lack of collateral assets were the cornerstones of the exhaustive webinar. Diminishing marginal returns to capital and small loans requiring high rates of interest for sustainability while keeping in mind the risks associated were graphically explained in layman terms. The webinar also focused on optimization of the profits while including all the sections of the population so that entrepreneurship from the grassroots and the economic growth of the nation can go hand in hand without hampering the profitability of the institutions. The concluding part of the talk had discussions on women empowerment; role of traditional money lenders and how education and skill development boosts profitability exponentially. The seminar ended on a positive note with the conclusion that future is quite bright for micro lenders and the how the structure is quite



A short course on Python under the supervision of Dr. Prithviraj Guha(Associate Professor, department of Economics)was organised by the department of Economics from 30.04.2022 to 15.05.2022. The University believes that delivery of a short course on course added immense value to the students' employability and research potential by exposing them to modern, data techniques early in their career. The department further believes that practicing data science techniques will inform and enrich the overall research environment and imbibe a sense of excitement and learning urge among all cohorts of the department's students and scholars. No less importantly, introduction to Python or similar other non-proprietary software enhances students skill portability. They become more prepared for picking up different other software later in their academic career whereas, the analytical techniques taught in this course will remain in other analsysis platforms. 
Search Techniques Using E-Databases and E-Journals:

Searching relevant authoritative scholarly information precisely on Web is both an art and science. There are thousands of multiple sources scattered across the web aiming to provide different kinds of information like Bibliographic Information, Full text research articles, Open Educational Resources (OER), Patent Information etc. Since different types of databases use different technology and search interface, effective searching on a particular databases or search engine needs technological knowledge about that particular search engine or the databases. Also search strategy and query string formulations for databases and search engines differ greatly. Further, manging search history and organising relevant retrieved information requires technological skills and advanced knowledge of technological tools like Zotero, Mendeley, Google drive, etc. Moreover, research analytics tools and Altmetrics tools are important parts of research life to enhance research visibility and to gain insights on a particular research area. This workshop thus aimed to provide knowledge and empower students and scholars in the following areas —

- 1. Identification of relevant sources to start a research work on a given topic.
- 2. Technological features and kinds of content aggregation of different databases and types of search engines and their features.
- 3. Advanced search formulation strategy and procedures including query string syntaxes for different kinds of databases like Scopus citation databases, patent databases, bibliographic databases, etc.
- 4. Maintaining search profiles and exporting search results by using cloud computing technology.
- 5. Organising required research papers using virtual reference management software like Zotero and Mendeley.
- 6. Use of virtual reference management software Mendeley and Zotero in real time research writing.







Dr. Sumita Saha(Dean of the Humanities and Social Sciences and Coordinator of NSS cell), Dr. Mery Biswas(Associate Professor, Department of Geography, Presidency University) and Dr. Shilpa Shaw(Associate Professor, Department of Political Science, Presidency University) who are active also university the of unit NSS of the members provided their unbound assistance to successfully executed the webinar. Dr. Puja Ray(Assistant Professor, Department of Life Sciences, Presidency University), the Webinar with a vote of thanks. convenor of the programme concluded the Objectives of the Webinar: The guiding agenda of the seminar can be summed up in seven points as established by Dr. Srinivas, the introductory speaker: Acknowledging and taking advantage of the demographic dividends of India due to the youth constituting the lion's share of the Indian population. India's median age of 26.7 years is the youngest in the world, therefore better equipped in developing immunity against the Corona virus and overcoming the onslaughts of COVID-19 induced health complications. A 72% net literacy rate on top of that would further improve the

nation's chances of thriving and emerging as a global winner despite the dismal pandemic. Identifying key resources available, playing to our strengths and developing skill sets-a weakness that must be promptly dealt with. As young people focus must be on curbing the spread of the virus through various means. Identifying roles of global and local organizations and striving for establishing a synergy between them for a better future. Equally emphasising on coping up with mental strain due to the pandemic-induced boredom, depression, fear, frustration, negativity and the like. Stigma-centred fear must also be given attention. Focusing on the greater future and not settling for a myopic perception of success establishing a global preparedness monitoring board that is vigilant and industrious. Monitoring the consumption habits by rejecting processed food and prioritising vegetables and fruits and adding physical activities to daily regime. Refusing alcohol intake and reduction tobacco consumption was also highlighted. Dr. Sugopa Sengupta shared her views on the impact of PPE on healthcare workers and the environment. She talked about how India had started from scratch and at one point was producing 4.5 lakh PPE kits every single day and emerging as a top exporter. PPEs had taken a great toll and had caused immense discomfort to frontline workers and healthcare workers alike. Customised PPE kits had somewhat alleviated them. PPEs becoming a big source of dangerous biomedical waste has been managed by the introduction of biodegradable kits. Recycling shredded PPE kits in a pyrolysis thermal reactor and making a fuel with similar properties to that of fossil fuels is also a revelation as highlighted by Dr. Sengupta. Dr. Sutapa Saha talked on the science of 'Coronavirus and COVID-19' while busting myths, curbing misinformation and half facts. She also enlightened the participants on the criticality and fatality of the virus. T3 programmes (Testing, Tracking and Tracing) and the role of Arogya Setu App and the progress of different international and indigenous vaccines were some other topics she elaborated upon. The efforts put into the Webinar and the literary discussions was well lauded by Dr. Asok Sanyal who extended his gratitude and sincerity as the two and a half hour session ended with a vote of thanks by Dr. Puja Ray.



equipped in developing immunity against the corona virus and overcoming the onslaughts of COVID-19 induced health complications. A 72% net literacy rate on top of that would further improve the nation's chances of thriving and emerging as a global winner despite the dismal pandemic. Identifying key resources available, playing to our strengths and developing skill setsa weakness that must be promptly dealt with. As young people focus must be on curbing the spread of the virus through various means. Identifying roles of global and local organizations and striving for establishing a synergy between them for a better future. Equally emphasizing on coping up with mental strain due to the pandemic-induced boredom, depression, fear, frustration, negativity and the like. Stigma-centered fear must also be given attention. Focusing on the greater future and not settling for a myopic perception of success establishing a global preparedness monitoring board that is vigilant and industrious. Monitoring the consumption habits by rejecting processed food and prioritising vegetables and fruits and adding physical activities to daily regime. Refusing alcohol intake and reduction tobacco consumption was also highlighted. Dr. Sugopa Sengupta shared her views on the impact of PPE on healthcare workers and the environment. She talked about how India had started from scratch and at one point was producing 4.5 lakh PPE kits every single day and emerging as a top exporter. PPEs had taken a great toll and had caused immense discomfort to frontline workers and healthcare workers alike. Customized PPE kits had somewhat alleviated them. PPEs becoming a big source of dangerous biomedical waste has been managed by the introduction of biodegradable kits. Recycling shredded PPE kits in a pyrolysis thermal reactor and making a fuel with similar properties to that of fossil fuels is also a revelation as highlighted by Dr. Sengupta. Dr. Sutapa Saha talked on the science of 'Coronavirus and COVID-19' while busting myths, curbing misinformation and half facts. She also enlightened the participants on the criticality and fatality of the virus. T3 programmes (Testing, Tracking and Tracing) and the role of Arogya Setu App and the progress of different international and indigenous vaccines were some other topics she elaborated upon. The efforts put into the Webinar and the literary discussions was well lauded by Dr. Asok Sanyal who extended his gratitude and sincerity as the two and a half hour session ended with a vote of thanks by Dr. Puja Ray.



Menstrual Hygiene

Globally, approximately 52% of the female population (26% of the total population) is of reproductive age. Among these women and girls will menstruate each month for three to six days. In most parts of the world, it remains taboo and is rarely talked about and thus female fails to learn the important of menstrual hygiene.

Before, discussing about menstruation it is very important to understands the meaning of it, and unfold all the stereotypical notions attached to it. Girls typically start to menstruate during puberty or adolescence, typically between the ages of ten and sixteen. The menstrual cycle is the monthly series of changes a woman's body goes through in preparation for the possibility of pregnancy. Each month, one of the ovaries releases an egg — a process called ovulation. At the same time, hormonal changes prepare the uterus for pregnancy.

NSS cell in collaboration with Presidency University conducted a session with collaboration of Unicharm India on "Menstrual Hygiene Session" with collaboration of Unicharm India on 14th August 2020.

 The session started with an introduction about 'Menstruation' where a detailed presentation was held to first unroll the taboo and misconception it has in the society.

Common period taboos include the idea that women are impure, dirty, or sinful while they are menstruating. Some women are discouraged from touching or washing their genitals during their periods to eliminate the possibility that they might contaminate the water of a bathing area. Menstrual blood is the same as any other body fluid and bathing regularly prevents bacterial infections.

The elementary locus of the session was based on the following aspects: -

• Educating women about what is menstruation and how the menstruation cycle works (Female reproductive system and how it functions) – The menstrual cycle is usually around 28 days but can vary from 21 to 35 days. Each cycle involves the release of an egg (ovulation) which moves into the uterus through the fallopian tubes. Most women and girls suffer from period pains such as abdominal cramps, nausea, fatigue, feeling faint, headaches, back ache and general discomfort. They can also experience emotional and psychological changes (e.g., heightened feelings of sadness, irritability, or anger) due to changing hormones. This varies from person to person and can change significantly over time.

- Potential risks to health of poor menstrual hygiene:
 - a) Unclean sanitary napkins can lead to potential infection, urine infection is a common infection which occurs frequently on women.
 - b) Vaginal products are often harmful and not safe which causes bacterial infections.
 - e) Using tampons in certain conditions can lead to unusual vaginal discharges.
 - Importance of good menstrual hygiene habits and how to maintain it. The session upheld the following points as the utmost fundamental habits which needs to be learned in order to maintain menstrual hygiene: -
 - a) Changing sanitary napkin every 4-6 hours, beyond that period it is not good for
 - b) Washing vagina properly, a mandatory and very useful method to keep the body
 - c) Avoid using soaps or vagina hygiene products which may be looks very attractive due
 - d) Disposing of the sanitary napkin properly, both health and environmental checks
 - e) Multiple method of sanitation is harmful, thus mono method should be followed by every woman.
 - How Periods and meditation can work wonders in giving women a good reproductive

Meditation during your period, in addition to any prescription drugs that may help reduce your PMS symptoms, can greatly help with pain and other PMS-related discomforts. Meditation can relieve bloating caused by water retention during menstruation, as well as menopausal symptoms like hot flashes and night sweats.

- Good practice in providing menstrual hygiene guidance to girls:
 - a) Train mothers, teachers and other trusted adults who can provide menstrual hygiene
 - b) Incorporate girls-only menstrual hygiene learning and discussion sessions in
 - e) Incorporate menstrual hygiene into the school curriculum.
 - d)Establish youth clubs with girls' menstrual hygiene discussion groups.
 - e) Use trained female instructors to run girls-only sessions at religious institutions, such as mosques, churches, temples, on providing menstrual hygiene information.

The NSS cell, comprising of about 220 students had organised a Women led integrated solid waste management workshop in the slums of Bagbazaar Paschim Banga Matshya Unnyan Samity Bagbazaar, Kolkata-03, Ward No. 07 on 31st March, 2017. It is one of the two areas they had adopted. 40 students had participated in this programme. The workshop narrated the workings of the project funded by ITC and implemented by BITAN, a very much wellknown NGO for its expertise with the issues related to Reproductive & Child Health Rights, and Solid & Liquid Resource Management. The entire programme consisted of two parts: technical session and interactive session. In the first session the students were shown a detailed documentary film on how actually the solid waste management programme is being diligently conducted by BITAN organization in the suburban and rural areas of West Bengal by local women since 2014. In a thriving metropolis like Kolkata, waste management becomes extremely essential to ensure the overall health and hygiene of the masses. Densely populated and unorganised areas like this particular locality can be breeding grounds for various sanitation related diseases, but on an optimistic note, with a few management measures and spread of awareness, areas like these can be great producers of organic manure. The film focused on several environmental issues and demonstrated the students how kitchen waste collected by the underprivileged women is being used to produce organic manure which is an healthier and safer solution to the chemical fertilizers. A Women self-help group was used to generate a pool of money from waste management which was further utilised to empower these underprivileged sections of the society. In the interactive session, the participating students were encouraged to put forward their views and opinions and play their part in planning how solid waste management programme can be initiated in the adopted slum of the NSS Cell of Presidency University. A campaigning at the adopted area of Bagbazar was also conducted on the 18th April, 2017 with the hope of spreading awareness and encouragement.


On the 8th of April, 2021, the department of Economics of Presidency College had conducted a digital seminar titled 'The past and future of microcredit'. The event was supervised and coordinated by Professor Zakir Hussain of Department of Economics, Presidency University. Professor Jonathan Murdoch graced the event with his deep and insightful presentation on microfinance, its history and how it should be perceived. Prof. Jonathan Morduch is currently Professor of Public Policy and Economics at the Robert F. Wagner Graduate School of Public Service, University of New York. He is a development economist most well-known for his significant academic contributions to assessing the impact of microfinance since the early years of the movement. What started in Dhaka has grown into a revolutionary movement around the world especially in a booming economies like India and Bangladesh. Microfinance refers to the financial services provided to low-income individuals or groups who are typically excluded from traditional banking. Through simple anecdotes and factual and graphical evidences Prof. Murdoch illustrated selective takes on the past and future of microfinance all the addressing rural poverty with focus on homogeneous participation irrespective of gender, or economic class, participation of NGOs, along with talks of nutrition, health and education. Challenges of development policies like market failure, unreliable services, social business, harnessing the market to reach mass scale and deprivation of the poor communities due to lack of collateral assets were the cornerstones of the exhaustive webinar. Diminishing marginal returns to capital and small loans requiring high rates of interest for sustainability while keeping in mind the risks associated were graphically explained in layman terms. The webinar also focused on optimization of the profits while including all the sections of the population so that entrepreneurship from the grassroots and the economic growth of the nation can go hand in hand without hampering the profitability of the institutions. The concluding part of the talk had discussions on women empowerment; role of traditional money lenders and how education and skill development boosts profitability exponentially. Identifying key resources available, playing to our strengths and developing skill sets-a weakness that must be promptly dealt with. As young people focus must be on curbing the spread of the virus through various means. Identifying roles of global and local organizations and striving for establishing a synergy between them for a better future. Equally emphasising on coping up with mental strain due to the pandemic-induced boredom, depression, fear, frustration, negativity and the like. Stigma-centred fear must also be given attention. Focusing on the greater future and not settling for a myopic perception of success establishing a global preparedness monitoring board that is vigilant and industrious. Monitoring the consumption habits by rejecting processed food and prioritising vegetables and fruits and adding physical activities to daily regime. Refusing alcohol intake and reduction tobacco consumption was also highlighted. Dr. Sugopa Sengupta shared her views on the impact of PPE on healthcare workers and the environment. She talked about how India had started from scratch and at one point was producing 4.5 lakh PPE kits every single day and emerging as a top exporter. PPEs had taken a great toll and had caused immense discomfort to frontline workers and healthcare workers alike. Customised PPE kits had somewhat alleviated them. PPEs becoming a big source of dangerous biomedical waste has been managed by the introduction of biodegradable kits. Recycling shredded PPE kits in a pyrolysis thermal reactor and making a fuel with similar properties to that of fossil fuels is also a revelation as highlighted by Dr. Sengupta. Dr. Sutapa Saha talked on the science of 'Coronavirus and COVID-19' while busting myths, curbing misinformation and half facts. She also enlightened the participants on the criticality and fatality of the virus. T3 programmes (Testing, Tracking and Tracing) and the role of Arogya Setu App and the progress of different international and indigenous vaccines were some other topics she elaborated upon. Equally emphasizing on coping up with mental strain due to the pandemic-induced boredom, depression, fear, frustration, negativity and the like. Stigma-centered fear must also be given attention. Focusing on the greater future and not settling for a myopic perception of success establishing a global preparedness monitoring board that is vigilant and industrious. Monitoring the consumption habits by rejecting processed food and prioritising vegetables and fruits and adding physical activities to daily regime. Refusing alcohol intake and reduction tobacco consumption was also highlighted. Dr. Sugopa Sengupta shared her views on the impact of PPE on healthcare workers and the environment. She talked about how India had started from scratch and at one point was producing 4.5 lakh PPE kits every single day and emerging as a top exporter. PPEs had taken a great toll and had caused immense discomfort to frontline workers and healthcare workers alike. Customized PPE kits had somewhat alleviated them. PPEs becoming a big source of dangerous biomedical waste has been managed by the introduction of biodegradable kits. Recycling shredded PPE kits in a pyrolysis thermal reactor and making a fuel with similar properties to that of fossil fuels is also a revelation as highlighted by Dr. Sengupta. Dr. Sutapa Saha talked on the science of 'Coronavirus and COVID-19' while busting myths, curbing misinformation and half facts. She also enlightened the participants on the criticality and fatality of the virus. T3 programmes (Testing, Tracking and Tracing) and the role of Arogya Setu App and the progress of different international and indigenous vaccines were some other topics she elaborated upon. 

There was an interaction session between the children and Dr. Majumder through which she tried to make them aware about the efficiency of rain water and some immerging issues about water scarcity. Secondly, there was a prize distribution ceremony among the children who participated in the drawing competition. Thirdly, following the prescriptions, medicines and zeolite solutions ware distribute among the people.
